


Recognition for Eblana Club's **President Tom Byrne**




Tánaiste announces new berthage arrangements for **Inshore Patrol Vessels in Dun-Laoghaire**

Tánaiste and Minister for Defence, Micheál Martin, has instructed officials to enter into discussions with Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council to secure berthage space in Dún Laoghaire harbour.

Following today's announcement, the Department of Defence will engage with the County Council to agree on terms for the use of Carlisle Pier over the short term. A detailed business case is currently being developed by the Defence Forces for the longer term Naval Service presence on the East Coast.

Dún Laoghaire Tidy Towns celebrates a successful year



This month Dun Laoghaire Tidy Towns (DLTT) held an event in the Eblana Club honoring the journey since its 2020 restart, inspired by local community members Betty Coffey, Mary O'Keefe, and Brian Flynn. Beginning with ten dedicated volunteers, DLTT steadily grew, establishing Green, Blue, and Recycling teams, and partnering with Dun Laoghaire County Council.

Transformative milestones included the involvement of Transition Year students and the 2023 addition of the "Eblana guys" (International Protection Applicants), swelling volunteer numbers and making DLTT a visible force in the community. Partnering with DLCRA also mobilised resident street cleanups. DLTT's efforts earned two Tidy District awards: Best Town/Village (population 9001+) and Most Improved Group, recognising the group's unique scale and remarkable progress, attributed significantly to by the Eblana Avenue volunteers. The get together in the Eblana Club celebrated these accomplishments and the community spirit fueling them.

Alpine skating trail is coming to Dún Laoghaire this Christmas



Fraudulent QR Codes on Parking Pay and Display

The Council have been made aware of a scam involving fraudulent QR Codes being placed on parking meters.

If you are using pay & display parking, please visit payzone.ie to pay for your parking online. The scam works by sticking a fraudulent QR code over the valid QR code on the machine.



Shop Front Improvement Grants

DLR CoCo established the Shop Front Improvement Scheme to support the improvement of the overall appearance of commercial properties that front onto public streets within Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown. Business owners carrying out shopfront improvements may be eligible for a grant of 50 per cent of the cost (before VAT) of the works, subject to a maximum grant of €5,000 per premises.
